## Wild Rose General Information

The CA-ADA Fall Fling Dressage Show is also sanctioned as Alberta Wild Rose Competition: EC tests are being offered at the Wild Rose Show. Alberta Equestrian Federation Wild Rose-sanctioned competitions are to be run in accordance with the AEF Wild Rose Rules. An AEF membership is required to show in the Wild Rose Show. Fees should be paid to AEF – <a href="https://www.albertaequestrian.com">www.albertaequestrian.com</a>. EC memberships for the horse or the rider are <a href="https://www.albertaequestrian.com">not</a> required if you are entering only Wild Rose classes.

## **Gold General Information**

The CA-ADA Fall Fling Dressage Show is sanctioned as a Gold competition of Equestrian Canada,

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will beheld and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

An Equestrian Canada Gold (or higher) Membership, and an AEF membership are required for the rider. Feesshould be paid to Equestrian Canada – www.equestrian.ca and AEF – www.albertaequestrian.com respectively. Horses must also have an Equestrian Canada horse recording, or temporary horse license.

## **Statement of Principle**

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All persons shall be committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possiblestandards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions, and;
- Actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

## **Biosecurity and Equine VaccinationProtocols**

#### **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:**

- 1. Proof of Negative Coggins is required at these competitions and must be dated with in the last 12 months.
- Proof of Vaccination and Coggins: You must provide proof of vaccination and Coggins for ALL of yourhorses on the grounds, showing or not.Required Vaccines are: Equine Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 (Rhino) – within 6 months (180 Days) but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds.
- 3. **Keep copies of your Vaccination records** in your tack room or in your truck/trailer. You may be asked by CA-ADA personnel or to present your health papers at any time.
- 4. **Ship-Ins** If you ship in and out daily, keep copies of your Vaccination records in your truck/trailer. You may be asked to present these records. The Ship-in lot will be checked daily. If proper records are not immediately available, the horse(s) must a.) remain under observation until the paperworkis presented, or b.) will be asked to leave the grounds. **Ship-ins may ONLY park in the designated area**

## **Entry Information**

- 1. Entries must be received no later than **Monday, August 23<sup>rd</sup> with full payment**. There are two ways to enter the shows:
  - a. Equestrian Entries online for your entries at <a href="www.equestrianentries.com">www.equestrianentries.com</a>. This allows the use of a creditcard to pay for your entries. Equestrian entries does charge a fee for this service. Any entries using Equestrian Entries will be entered into a draw for \$50 rebate on their entry.
  - b. Scan and email your entry to CalgaryAreaDressage@gmail.com and pay by email bank transfer, also to CalgaryAreaDressage@gmail.com. The password for the email bank transfer should be set to <u>dressage</u>

#### **Gold Licence Information**

- 1. ECGold Sport licenses are required for the competitor. The owner must have a valid ECGold license.
- 2. The competitor or owner may pay a fee of \$20 to compete at the Gold Show if they hold a valid Silver license, or a fee of \$40 to compete at a Gold Show if they hold a valid Bronze license. The single event Sportlicense Upgrade is valid only for that competition.
- 3. Non-Equestrian Canada members will be permitted to exhibit in the Gold Show with the purchase of a Temporary Sport license from the Show Office at a cost of \$71. A Temporary Sport license is not accumulative and will not apply against payment of a full license. Only Equestrian Canada members holding avalid competition license are eligible to receive Equestrian Canada Annual Awards.
- 4. Note: At Gold shows in Alberta, persons who want to purchase a Temporary Sport or Horse license have to show proof of an AEF license.
- 5. Canadian horses competing in an EC Gold show are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording Annual Activation Fee to compete, a temporary Horse Registration form may be purchased. Horse Recording number is the control number used by EC and must be included on the entry. Horses must be entered under the name appearing on the Horse recording. Foreign horses will be allowed to compete upon submitting an Affidavit for Foreign-Owned Horses to the Show Office.
- 6. Temporary license and one show upgrades will be permitted for Gold classes only. Provincial Championships require full licenses prior to competition. Adult Amateurs, ensure that you have declared on your EC Sport License.

#### Wild Rose license Information

1. Entries in the Wild Rose show only <u>do not</u> need EC Sport licenses for the rider nor EC Horse Recordings. The rider does require an AEF (or other Provincial) membership. Tests ridden in the Wild Rose classes are not eligible for Equestrian Canada awards.

#### Rules

1. Entries for the show will be processed in the order that they are received. The organizing committee reserves the right to limit or refuse entries subject to championship rules limiting a competitions right to refuse entries.

- 2. Riders may pay one administration fee and enter both Gold and Wild Rose classes.
- 3. Exhibitors, judges and show officials are responsible for knowledge of the rules. Full details of horse show operation, EC (including FEI) rules; list of recognized judges and other vital information is in the Rule Book copyright for the exclusive use of recognized shows.
- 4. Warm up in the show rings will be allowed on move in day from 1PM until 7PM. Horses that are not stabled on the grounds may also haul-in on move in day and school in the show rings. Schooling in the show rings is also allowed for one hour after the last rider in that ring on the first show day. Lunging is only allowed in the dedicated lunging area.
- 5. There will be one warm up area, situated beside the show rings. The warm up area is open starting one hourbefore the show opens each day, and for one hour at the end of the first show day.
- 6. Show correspondence will be handed through email and Fox Village. Ride times will be posted on the Fox Village website once they are ready, and an email will be sent to riders and owners once the times are posted. Ride times will also be posted at the show office. Riders are responsible for checking Fox village as ride times may change. Please provide a correct email on your entry form to ensure that you are getting the communications.
- 7. It is a condition of entry that neither the show organizing committee, nor Rocky Mountain Show Jumping will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators or competitors.
- 8. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times and are not allowed by the rings. Smoking is not allowed in the stabling areas or indoor arena.
- 9. Horses must leave the show grounds within 2 hours of classes ended on the last day of the show. Anyarrangements to stay extra time must be made in advance with the show office.
- 10. A protest at an EC sanctioned competition other than those specific matters covered in division rules must comply with the following provisions: a) a protest is eligible only if made by an officiating judge, and owner, lessee, trainer, coach competitor or authorized agent, in the division in which the question arises; b) a protest must be made in writing and addressed to the Show Secretary; c) must be signed; and d) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash. For full details see rule A1204 Gen. Regulations.
- 11. Please submit your Freestyle Music when registering and the music must be electronic, please email to the show secretary and/or provide an iPod with the music. Music will be tested on Friday at check-in. All freestyles (provincial or Gold show) will be ridden on the Saturday.
- 12. Gold entries must pay a mandatory DC Levy of \$10 and an Equine Canada drug fee of \$7. These fees are not required for Wild Rose entries.
- 13. The gates will be closed for all provincial Championship classes
- 14. Whips are not allowed to be ridden with in the Provincial Championship classes
- 15. No horse/rider combination may compete in more than two consecutive levels or more than one division in the AB Provincial Championships. Article 7.26
- 16. Test readers are only allowed for the Gold and Wildrose classes. Riders in the AB Provincial Championship classes must ride their tests from memory.
- 17. As per EC 7.11.12 (3) in the Gold Championships, the schooling of the horse may only be done by the competing rider from the time of arrival at the show grounds until after the completion of their last test under penalty of elimination.
- 18. **QUALIFYING SCORES FOR PROVINCIAL CLASSES ARE REQUIRED**. Third Level and below, 2 scores of 60% or greater from GOLD level technical tests. Fourth Level and above 2 scores of 55% or greater from GOLD level technical tests. Same show, same judge allowed. TESTS MUST BE FROM 2021. Please indicate the tests on your entry in the area provided.
- 19. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event (A602.5). This only applies to Gold/Provincial horses.
- 20. Late entries will be accepted, space permitting with a late fee.
- 21. Post entries, to fill scratches will be allowed if scheduling permits. To be eligible for post entry, the horse/rider must already be registered in the show as either a competing or non-competing horse and must register with the show secretary.

- 22. All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and a signature for the person(s) responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to compete without a person(s) responsible signature.
- 23. Junior riders must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian.
- 24. Hors Concours entries will be accepted with full fees. Entrants are subject to EC or AEF rules and Hors Concours entries are not eligible for ribbons or awards.
- 25. Horse substitutions (except in the Gold Championships) or class changes will be allowed at the discretion of the show secretary and if accepted will be assessed a change fee of \$30.00.
- 26. Non-competing (schooling horses) will be accepted. Entries must pay the administration fee, a non-competing horse fee and stabling fees. Schooling horses do not require a horse recording. Riders must have proof of AEFor provincial membership.
- 27. The Masters Test of Choice Class The Masters Test of Choice Class is an EC dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 years and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own that provides a fair playing field for senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginner to advanced. The class will feature one test per day please identify which test on your entry. Please review EC rules for the list of accommodations available. Masters riders may also compete in non-Masters dressage classes.
- 28. Cancellations prior to Monday, August 23, 2021 will have all fees less the Administration Fee refunded.
- 29. Cancellations after the closing date and prior to Wednesday, August 25 at 1pm before the show will have the stabling fees, RV hookup, EC fees and 50% of the class fees refunded. The administration fees and 50% of the class fees will not be refunded.
- 30. All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. (E.4.0).
- 31. Competitions must be ready to compete when scheduled and are responsible for checking foxvillage for any ride times
- 32. The horse may compete at any level up to a maximum of four tests per day including the freestyle e.g. one horse could competition a total of four technical tests, with two different riders each riding two tests. The horse may compete only in two consecutive levels.
- 33. Every entry will have an identification number which must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling area as wellas in the competition rings
- 34. Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons, or prizes. (E9.10.7)
- 35. When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:
  - 1st 60% or higher
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> 57% to 59.9%
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> 54% to 56.9%
  - 4<sup>th</sup> 51% to 53.9%
  - ii. No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 4th position. (E9.9.10)

#### Volunteers:

A Show of this magnitude does not run without volunteers. Gates must be closed for all AB Provincials Classes. Runners are required for all rings. Every effort will be made to ensure that volunteer shifts do not conflict with ride or warm up times. A reminder that CA/ADA members must volunteer for at least 3 hours over the 2021 year at CA-ADA events in order to be eligible for education subsidies. Volunteer shifts will be kept to a 2 hour maximum. Please indicate on the show registration if you are available for a shift. All volunteers should check in at the show office 10min before the start of their shift

## **Championships & Awards**

- 1. The Gold Show will have Championships awarded. The average of all Gold tests ridden will be used to determine the Champion, and at least two (2) tests must be ridden to be eligible for show championships. The highest average will be used to determine the Show Champion. TOC classes do not count towards the championships.
  - i. Championships will be awarded from Intro-FEI Level (Open/Junior / Adult Amateur)
  - ii. The show committee reserves the right to combine divisions if there are insufficient riders in each category. Championships will not be awarded if there are less than 3 riders per level.
  - iii. Champions of the Gold show will be notified and invited to pick up their prizes from the show office
  - iv. There are no championships awarded for the Wildrose show
- 2. Alberta Provincial Championships will be awarded by totaling the scores from each test in the championship divisions described in the class list, and are as follows:

Alberta Provincial Freestyle Championships will be awarded by totaling the higher percentage from the technical championships division classes taking place on Saturday and Sunday plus the freestyle percentage from the championship freestyle classes (taking place on Saturday). They will be awarded as follows

The Champions for all Provincial Award Presentations should be in show attire. Mounted presentations are not required; however, we ask that the horse be presented with a bridle for photos. Riders not present or not correctly turned out will forfeit all prizes and awards. Reserve Champions-4<sup>th</sup> place may pick up awards at the show office.

A presentation schedule will be posted at the show office. It is your responsibility to check for presentation time

Cash prizes will be awarded for championships as follows from 1-4<sup>th</sup> place. Champions will receive their money at presentation, others may pick up at the show office.

Champion - \$125

Reserve Champion - \$75

3<sup>rd</sup> place - \$50

4<sup>th</sup> place - \$25

Article 7.25 At all EC championship competitions, any horse receiving less than 50% on a technical test will not be eligible for any championship awards.

- 3. The CA/ADA will have special member awards at the show for the high point junior, adult amateur and open riders in either the Provincial, Gold or Wild Rose show. To be eligible for the award, the rider must be a member in good standing with the CA/ADA as of June 1, 2021.
- 4. Depending on Sponsorship, the Show Committee reserves the right to award ad hoc prizes

## **Stabling**

- 5. Stabling is available but not mandatory. Stabling will open at 1:00pm the day before the show. The stabling fees do not include bedding. Shavings will be sold by pre-order on the entry form, at a cost of \$9.00 (including GST) a bag or by Rocky Mountain Show Jumping at the show office.
- 6. Competitors not stabling will be charged a daily haul in fee. The haul in horses may not tie to stalls in the stabling area, they should be kept by their trailer in the parking area across the road from the show grounds.
- 7. All horses that are stabled (including day stalls) must pay the mandatory environmental fee of \$31.50
- 8. A stabling chart will be provided at the start of the shows. It can be found at the show office and in the barns. Competitors may only use the stall and tack stall assigned to them. Any changes to stabling should be discussed with the show office.
- 9. If you would like to be stabled next to someone in particular, please ensure that the same stable group name is used on the entry form. When assigning stalls, every attempt will be made to accommodate special requests, but no guarantees can be made.

### ROCKY MOUNTAIN SHOW JUMPING BIO-SECURITY PROTOCOL

Rocky Mountain Show Jumping has implemented a Health & Bio-Security Protocol to decrease the risk of introduction and/or spread of contaminates, contagious or infectious diseases by movements of horses onto or off the venue.

#### HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

- 5. Proof of Negative Coggins is required at these Tournaments and must be dated with in the last 12 months.
- 6. **Proof of Vaccination and Coggins:** You must provide proof of vaccination and Coggins for ALL of your horses on the grounds, showing or not. Required Vaccines are: **Equine Influenza and EHV1 & 4 (Rhino) within 6 months (180 Days) but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds.**
- 7. **Keep copies of your Vaccination records** in your tack room or in your truck/trailer. You may be asked by Rocky Mountain Show Jumping personnel orto present your health papers at anytime.
- 8. **Ship-Ins (if permitted):** If you ship in and out daily, keep copies of your Vaccination records in your truck/trailer. You may be asked to present these records. The Ship-in lot will be checked daily. If proper records are not immediately available, the horse(s) must a.) remain under RMSJ Staff observation until the paperwork is presented, or b.) will be asked to leave the grounds. **Ship-ins may ONLY park in the designated areas.**

#### DIRECT AND INDIRECT CONTACT BETWEEN HORSES AND PEOPLE

The most common path for spreading germs and disease is contact among horses, humans and other animals. Bodily fluids such as nasal discharge, saliva and sweat can carry germs which are easily transmitted from horse to horse through direct and indirect contact.

- Limit <u>horse-to-horse</u> contact
- Limit horse-to-human-to-horse contact
- Limit horse-to-dog (other animal)-to horse, or horse-to-dog-to-human-to-horse contact.
- 1. Dogs are permitted in the stabling area only. Dogs must be on a leash controlled by a human. Loose dogs will not be tolerated. Loose dogs in the stabling area, competition area, ship-

in area, or found anywhere on the show grounds will be detained. \$50 fine for the first offense, \$100 for the second, and so on. Multiple offenses may result in expulsion from the grounds. Dogs can be a leading cause of the spread of germs – horses nuzzle the dog, people pet the dog then pet the next horse – and before you know it, the germs have been spread. Please be courteous and clean up after you dogs on the grounds

- -RMSJ will have doggie bags and cans available.
- 2. **Restrict unnecessary movement of horses out of their aisle or barn.** Don't take a horse to another barn to be tacked up, braided, clipped, etc. It may seem easier sometimes, but sharing equipment and grooming supplies, or coming into nose-to-nose contact with other horses or soiled surfaces can spreadgerms.
- 3. **Do not lead horses down other tent/barn aisles.** Don't cut through a tent/barn on your way to the paddock or ring; go around the perimeter of thetent/barn. It may be shorter, but it risks your horse coming into to contact with other horses, soiled surfaces and equipment, dogs, etc.
- 4. **Don't let horses make nose-to-nose contact** with horses from other barns when in common areas such as wash racks, at the rings, or while grazing. Yes, it's cute when they want to visit with each other, but germs can spread just like the cold or flu going through a kid's classroom.
- 5. **Do not touch or pet, or feed treats to horses** from other barns unless necessary. Yes, we all want to pet all the horses we see, but be mindful that you may be spreading germs from one horse to another when you do this.

#### **EQUIPMENT HANDLING**

Soiled equipment is another common path for spreading germs and disease. Nasal discharge, saliva, sweat, and even soiled bedding can carry microbes and spreadthem via shared items such as tack, equipment, hoses, buckets, grooming supplies and towels.

- 1. **Do not let waterhoses touch buckets when filling.** Contact with a contaminated surface on a water bucket can be easily transmitted to the next bucket contacted.
- 2. Do not allow horses to drink from the hose.
- 3. Do not share water or feed buckets.
- 4. **Have hand sanitizer readily available,** and use it between grooming/tacking up horses. Keep it handy in the grooming stall, on your golf cart, and inyour grooming boxatthering
- 5. Use clean brushes and towels on each horse. If you don't have enough brushes for each horse to have his own set, be sure to wash them often.
- 6. **Don't share tack and equipment,** especially bits and bridles, unless they are cleaned between each use.

#### **BIO-SECURITY MEASURES**

Protecting the health of your horses is of the utmost importance to Rocky Mountain Show Jumping. In addition to the Bio-security Protocol for Vaccination and Event Participation Declaration, Rocky Mountain Show Jumping has compiled this list of Bio-Security Regulations for decreasing the risk of exposure or spread of disease.

- 1. Be sure to read the Bio-Security regulations, it reviews simple steps we all can take to keep horses healthy!
- 2 Horses Temperature is an easy way to monitor your horse. Take and record your horses temperature twice daily when it is at rest and NOT immediately following exercise and trailering. Horses temperature should be below 102°F
- 3. Trainers please let your braider know to about the new Bio-Security regulations.

#### RMSJ CONTINGENCY PLAN

Monitor your horses and contact TD Equine Veterinary Group at 403-691-9808 if you notice any unusual symptoms. Any sick or suspect horses are to bereported to the veterinary staff and will separated and taken to isolation stalls for testing and observation
