- 1. Applicants must be an Alberta resident and a member of the YD-ADA. (YD-ADA membership is obtained by becoming a youth member -25 years old and younger of a local Alberta Dressage Association chapter.)
- 2. Proof of being selected for 2023 NAYC (attach to your application).
- 3. Applications must be received by July 21, 2023.
